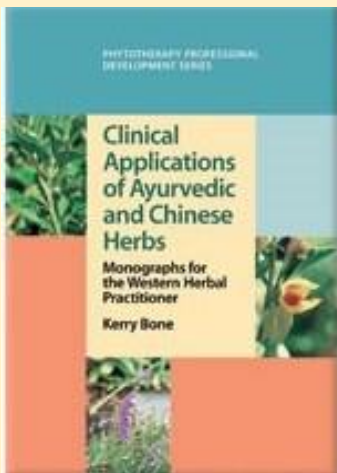


“Clinical Applications of Ayurvedic and Chinese Herbs”
